After two layouts had to be dismantled due to Navy change of duty orders, Bob began construction on a modular layout that the Navy would move each duty change. He briefly joined the NMRA in 1976, but dropped out due to increased demands by the Navy.


During the following years he continued to perfect his skills and modeling expertise.
